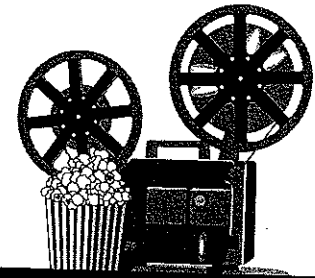


Nominate a Movie for an Academy Award



OBJECTIVE:

To create a PowerPoint presentation nominating a movie for an Academy Award

New Skills Reinforced:

In this activity, you will practice how to:

1. set a hyperlink screen tip.
2. hyperlink within a presentation.



PROJECT SCENARIO:

Ask any person you know what their favorite movie is and almost instantaneously, they will have a reply. From comedies and thrillers, to dramas and documentaries, some of the best movies ever made have never even come close to an Oscar nomination. In this project, you will create a PowerPoint presentation to convince an audience why your favorite movie should be nominated for an Academy Award.



STRATEGIES AND DESIGN TIPS TO FOLLOW:

1. Select a movie that you consider your all-time favorite and that you would like to learn more about.
2. When selecting fonts (typefaces), consider the type of movie you have selected.
3. Use consistent design and typestyle elements throughout your presentation.



BEFORE YOU BEGIN:

1. Carefully read through all parts included in this project.
2. Prior to starting any work on your computer, use the *Present It! Planning Layout Form* to sketch the content, layout, and design of the presentation you will be creating for this project. Use multiple copies if necessary.
3. Use the *Present It! PowerPoint Presentation Tips* provided in the Introduction as a guide while working on this project.
4. Unless otherwise noted, the layout, design, type size(s), and style(s) for this project will be left for you to decide.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Using Microsoft PowerPoint, create a NEW blank presentation.
2. Save the presentation as **PROJECT 14 – ACADEMY AWARD**.
3. Edit **slide 1**.



Using separate text boxes, key the text as shown.



Place text box 3 in the bottom right corner.
 Format the size, style, and placement of the text so that this slide projects a professional appearance.

1	A Night at the Oscars
2	The Oscars, awarded annually by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, showcase the best in movies, honoring films released in the previous year. This year's nominee is <i>[the movie title]</i> .

4. Insert **slide 2**.

- Place text box 3 in the bottom left corner.
- Insert a photo image of the Oscar Award above text box 3. If photo is not available, use equivalent clipart image.
- Hyperlink text box 3 to slide 2.
- Insert photo image(s) of each cast member. If photos are not available, use equivalent clipart images.
- Add additional text, graphics, and/or elements that will help enhance the content and appearance of this slide.
- Format the size, style, and placement of the text and elements (if applicable) so that this slide projects a professional appearance.

6. Insert **slide 4**.



□ Using separate text boxes, key the text as shown.



- Insert one or more photo images of the actor. If photo(s) are not available, use equivalent clipart images.
- Copy and paste the Oscar image and the hyperlinked text box 3 from slide 3, and place in the identical area.
- Add additional text, graphics, and/or elements that will help enhance the content and appearance of this slide.
- Format the size, style, and placement of the text and elements (if applicable) so that this slide projects a professional appearance.

1	Meet My Favorite Actor
2	[Include a five to seven sentence biographical summary that includes the following information: -Actor's full name. -Actor's age, birthdate, marital status. -Actor's city and state of residence. -Actor's family background. -Career highlights or first movie the actor was in. -Special interests or interesting facts about the actor.]

7. Insert **slide 5**.



□ Using separate text boxes, key the text as shown.



□ Copy and paste the Oscar image and the hyperlinked text box 3 from slide 3, and place in the identical area.

□ Add additional text, graphics, and/or elements that will help enhance the content and appearance of this slide.

□ Format the size, style, and placement of the text and elements (if applicable) so that this slide projects a professional appearance.

1	[Movie Title] Review
2	[Compose your own unique movie review that includes several things you liked most about the movie. The summary should be five to seven sentences and include the following: -What was the movie about? -Where did the movie take place? -What were some of the funny, dramatic, or thrilling things that happened in the movie?]

8. Insert **slide 6**.



□ Using separate text boxes, key the text as shown.



□ Copy and paste the Oscar image and the hyperlinked text box 3 from slide 3, and place in the identical area.

□ Add additional text, graphics, and/or elements that will help enhance the content and appearance of this slide.

□ Format the size, style, and placement of the text and elements (if applicable) so that this slide projects a professional appearance.

1	A "Must See" Movie
2	[Compose a four to six sentence paragraph about why you think this movie is worthy of an Academy Award. Include a list of ten adjectives or action words that best describe the movie.]

9. Insert **slide 7**.



In separate text boxes, key the text as shown.



Copy and paste the Oscar image and the hyperlinked text box 3 from slide 3, and place in the identical area.

Add additional text, graphics, and/or elements that will help enhance the content and appearance of this slide.

Format the size, style, and placement of the text and elements (if applicable) so that this slide projects a professional appearance.

10. Insert **slide 8**.

11. On slide 2, hyperlink each category in the Table of Contents to its corresponding slide.
12. Edit each hyperlink on slide 2 to include a screen tip that reads "Click a category to learn more."
13. Resave the presentation.
14. Run the slideshow and proofread your work carefully for accuracy, design, and format.
15. Print a copy of your presentation as handouts using 3 or 6 slides per page if required by your instructor.
16. If required, present this presentation to your instructor and/or your class.
