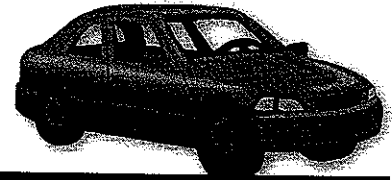


# Buying Your First Car



## OBJECTIVE:

To create a PowerPoint presentation comparing two cars you would like to some day purchase

## New Skills Reinforced:

In this activity, you will practice how to:

1. apply custom animation to graphics.
2. apply a sound to an animation effect.



## PROJECT SCENARIO:

For the past seventeen years, you and your parents have been depositing money into a savings account for you to use to buy a car. The time has come, and you have learned you have \$20,000 and not a penny more to spend on a car. Your parents are prepared to give you the money; however, they are first asking you to do some research on the two cars you have it narrowed down to. In this project, you will prepare a PowerPoint presentation to your parents about the two cars you are considering.



## STRATEGIES AND DESIGN TIPS TO FOLLOW:

1. While conducting research for both cars, be sure to consider the amount you can afford.
2. In order to not distract the audience, do not apply custom animation to every graphic in your presentation.
3. There are many Web sites available for researching your cars; however, you may want to visit [www.Edmunds.com](http://www.Edmunds.com) and [www.autotrader.com](http://www.autotrader.com) as a starting point.

1. Carefully read through all parts included in this project.
2. Prior to starting any work on your computer, use the *Present It! Planning Layout Form* to sketch the content, layout, and design of the presentation you will be creating for this project. Use multiple copies if necessary.
3. Use the *Present It! PowerPoint Presentation Tips* provided in the Introduction as a guide while working on this project.
4. Unless otherwise noted, the layout, design, type size(s), and style(s) for this project will be left for you to decide.

- Place text box 3 to the right of the vertical line.
- Place text box 4 to the left of the vertical line.
- Place text box 5 to the right of the vertical line.
- Insert a photo image of each car above its corresponding price (if photos are not available, use equivalent clipart images).
- Group text box 4 and its corresponding image.
- Custom animate the grouped object.
- Group text box 5 and its corresponding image.
- Custom animate the grouped object.
- Add additional text, graphics, and/or elements that will help enhance the content and appearance of this slide.
- Format the size, style, and placement of the text and elements (if applicable) so that this slide projects a professional appearance.

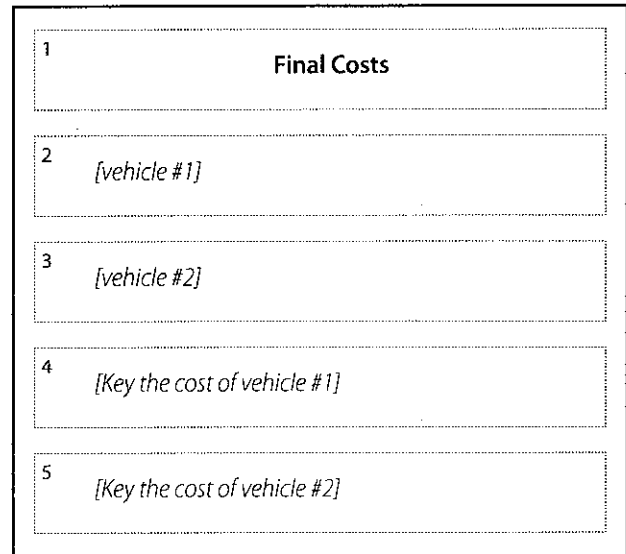
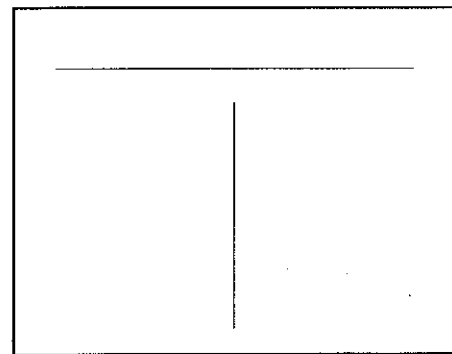




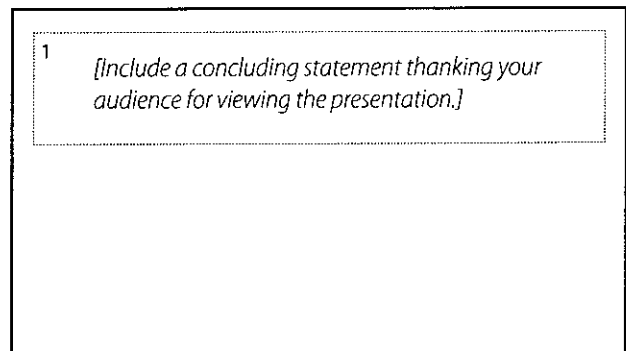
