Create and Design a Campaign Poster



To create a poster for a political campaign



PROJECT OVERVIEW:

When it comes to making a point, few methods of persuasion are as effective as campaign posters, whether they are advocating a political issue or promoting a candidate running for public office. The eye-catching combination of a large graphic image and a simple, straightforward message can have the power to instantly influence a voter's opinion. In this project, you will use your desktop publishing software to create a poster that supports either a political cause or candidate running for office.



GET TO KNOW WHAT YOU'RE DESIGNING:

The key to formulating a successful poster design is to understand that it must contain a brief and clear-cut message, and it needs to be easily understood, even if seen from a distance. Posters are typically placed in the community for public viewing and contain a graphic image that relates to the text. The primary goal of a campaign poster is to motivate an audience to act in favor of the message conveyed.



STRATEGIES AND DESIGN TIPS TO FOLLOW:

- Keep the poster's appearance simple and the message to the point.
- 2. Use a font for the poster's headline that is easily read from a distance. A block-style font, such as Arial Black, is a good font to consider.
- 3. Create a headline that immediately conveys to the reader what the poster represents.
- 4. Think of persuasive text that states how your candidate stands out in a positive way from other candidates, or why your political cause is in the public's best interest. Consider using facts and statistics that can help drive home your message.
- 5. Carefully read through all parts included in this project. Sefore beginning any work on your computer, use a blank sheet of paper to sketch the layout and design of the document you will be creating.

- 1. Using your desktop publishing software, create a new document.
- 2. Save the file as "Campaign Poster" to the "Publish It!" folder.
- 3. Set up your document using the "Page Setup Instructions" provided on the next page.
- 4. Complete the "Content and Design Steps to Follow" provided below.
- 5. Proofread your work carefully for accuracy, design, and format.
- 6. Resave the file.
- 7. Print a copy of the document. Refer to the "Suggested Printing and Finishing Instructions" provided below.



- 1. Decide on the subject of your poster, either promoting a political referendum or a candidate running for public office.
- 2. Include the following on your campaign poster:
 - A large, boldface headline, centered across the top of the page Example: "Elect John Doe for Class President"
 - A graphic image of either the candidate or something relating to the candidate or the referendum being promoted
 - · A slogan or tagline to capture the essence of your campaign poster's message
 - A brief summary describing the candidate or political cause
 - A bulleted list that provides highlights about the candidate or the political cause
 - A call to action message that encourages readers to act on the message being delivered in the poster Example: "Vote for John Doe on November 7th"
- 3. Add additional text and/or graphic elements to help enhance the look and design of the document.
- 4. Format the size, style, and placement of the text and other elements on the document so that it projects a professional design.
- 5. Go to Step 5 in the "Instructions" provided above.



Print the poster on cardstock or colored paper.
